Registration and pictures set for Aug. 3

Registration and picture day for all 4K through 12th grade students will be held on Thursday, Aug. 3. Registration will run in two sessions, with the first from 7 to 10 a.m. and the second from 3 to 6 p.m. Students and parents can attend either session. Both sessions will be held in the high school atrium at door No. 14.

The online registration on PowerSchool should be completed for all students before parents and students attend the Aug. 3 registration event.

Pardeeville Schools is using a registration process called eCollect. The online registration instructions are provided on the Pardeeville School District website homepage. Parents can login to their PowerSchool account to complete the registration.

Registration information for 2023-2024:

- Parents and guardians should begin the eRegistration process for each of their students before the Aug. 3 in-person registration event.
- Please be sure to look through **ALL** of the data currently recorded in each student tab pertaining to legal guardian information, emergency contacts, health concerns, parental permissions, etc. to make sure we have the most up-to-date information.
- Registration forms and fees are completed online. Fees can also be paid on Aug. 3 during the registration day with a check or cash as well.
- New families enrolling in Pardeeville Schools should contact the appropriate office to receive the online information to enroll your students.

If you don't have online access, there will be Chromebooks available at the school during the registration hours on Aug. 3 and in the office thereafter during business hours.

All 4K through 12th grade students will have school photos taken during registration on Aug. 3. Pictures will be done by Galley Studios this year. Picture order forms will be available online on each school's website. Make-up picture day is scheduled for Sept. 21.

Back-to-School Open House is Aug. 30 in all schools

The Pardeeville Area School District is hosting a district-wide, Back-to-School Open House on Wednesday, Aug. 30. The event will take place in all three schools in the district. It will run from 3 to 5 p.m. at Pardeeville Elementary School and from 3:30 to 5 p.m. at Pardeeville Middle School and Pardeeville High School.

Classrooms will be open and teachers will be present at the open house. This is an opportunity for students to see their classrooms, meet their teachers and drop off materials in preparation for their first day of school.


At Pardeeville Middle School, students and families can participate in a fun and informal scavenger hunt to familiarize themselves with the

building. There will also be an informational session entitled "What to Expect When You're Expecting a Middle Schooler." The intended audience for this program is 5th grade families and families new to the district, but anyone is welcome to attend. More information on the open house will be sent via email in mid-August.

Pardeeville Summer School included many different fun subjects and ran for three weeks during the month of June.

Early college credit program available to students

Junior and Senior students are allowed to enroll in one or more nonsectarian courses at an accredited 2- or 4-year school of higher education while a high school student. Courses must further the student's education academically or vocationally. Students may not take courses that are comparable to ones offered at Pardeeville High School.

Our district pays for the cost of tuition, texts and materials; transportation is not included. Because of cost factors, our district will carefully screen applications for appropriateness and deny payment when deadlines are not observed. To be considered for the Early College Credit Program during the first semester, the application must be submitted to the school board by March 1 of the previous year; for second semester enrollment, the application is due by Oct. 1 of the school year. Students interested should contact Mrs. Huset.

National Honor Society preparing for new group of inductees

The Pardeeville National Honor Society will be holding its induction of new members at the end of September or early October.

A letter of intent has been sent to potential inductees over the summer. They must choose to complete the required form indicating their service and leadership activities, which is due on Friday, Sept. 1. At this time, the Pardeeville National Honor Society Faculty Council, composed of five members of the high school staff, will meet to review the applications and make the final decision for acceptance into this prestigious group.

All students are finally contacted by mail indicating whether they have been accepted. The induction ceremony is the last step to the process, with its candle lighting ceremony, conducted by the officers and advisors.

Make sure medical forms are filled out at registration

Together, we will make this a great school year. Students learn best when they are healthy and in school.

Registration is the first step and many of you have already started this process. Please make sure that we are aware of any and all health concerns that your student has. This allows us to

better care for your student. The Department of Public Instruction requires a “Licensed Medical Practitioner’s” statement

that allows the Pardeeville Area School District to provide for your child’s “Special Dietary needs.” If your child needs a special diet, please take the form that is in Powerschool to your “Licensed Medical Practitioner” to have them fill it out. We need this form on file so we can provide your child the special diet required.

Next, if your student needs medication, prescription or nonprescription, please make sure the medication does not expire until after the school year is completed in June 2024. There are paper forms that need to be filled out for any medications taken during school hours.

Forms can be found on E-Reg, the school’s website, or at your building’s office. All medications should be in the original container with the student’s name on it (small bottles are helpful) and secured in the proper designated school’s office space unless stated otherwise regarding the use of inhalers or auto injectors. Medications not picked up after June 30, 2023, have been destroyed.

Also, we are required to monitor and report to the state, in the first 40 school days, students who are not up to date on their immunizations. Therefore, we greatly appreciate your assistance in letting us know if your child has received any vaccinations in the last year or is scheduled to receive vaccines. This will save you from getting calls from us because we make every effort before we have to put your student’s name on a noncompliant report to the state.

All kindergarten students will need documentation of the immunizations they have been given, and must be up-to-date with all of them. All 7th grade students will need a tdap for school immunization requirements (this changed this year from the previous 6th grade requirements). Tdap vaccine: This continues protection against tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis (whooping cough).

Other vaccinations to discuss with your health provider are

quadrivalent meningococcal conjugate (MCV4) (meningococcal ACWY) vaccine: This vaccine protects against infection from *Neisseria Meningitidis* in the lining of the brain, spinal cord, and bloodstream. Preteens should get the first dose when they are 11 or 12 and a booster at age 16. Human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine: This vaccine prevents some pre-cancers and cancers related to HPV. Pre-teens should get two doses before they turn 13 years old. A yearly flu vaccine: It protects against getting sick and spreading the flu virus. COVID-19 vaccines: Staying up to date on COVID-19 boosters will help prevent getting sick from COVID-19. Immunizations protect against and prevent the spread of diseases, however, please contact us if you are in need of a waiver.

You may bring any forms and medications to us at registration and we will see that they get to the proper places.

Nurses will be back on registration day on Aug. 3, and at the end of August to assist with any questions you may have. The High School and Middle School nurse’s office has moved and is now located in room 48 in the high school.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT FREE AND REDUCED PRICE SCHOOL MEALS FOR SCHOOL YEAR 2023-24

Dear Parent/Guardian:

Children need healthy meals to learn. Pardeeville Area School District offers healthy meals every school day. Breakfast costs \$1.90 for Elementary, \$2.15 for Middle School, and \$2.40 for High School; lunch costs \$3.05 for Elementary, \$3.30 for Middle School, and \$3.40 for High School. Your children may qualify for free meals or for reduced price meals. Reduced price is .30 for breakfast and .40 for lunch. This packet includes an application for free or reduced price meal benefits, and a set of detailed instructions. Below are some common questions and answers to help you with the application process.

1. WHO CAN GET FREE OR REDUCED PRICE MEALS?

- All children in households receiving benefits from FoodShare, the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR), or W-2 cash benefits are eligible for free meals, when listed on the application.
- Foster children that are under the legal responsibility of a foster care agency or court are eligible for free meals.
- Children participating in their school’s Head Start program are eligible for free meals.
- Children who meet the definition of homeless, runaway, or migrant are eligible for free meals.
- Children may qualify to receive free or reduced price meals if your household’s income is at or below the limits on the Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines.

2. HOW DO I KNOW IF MY CHILDREN QUALIFY AS HOMELESS, MIGRANT, OR RUNAWAY? Do the members of your household lack a permanent address? Are you staying together in a shelter, hotel, or other temporary housing arrangement? Does your family relocate on a seasonal basis? Are any children living with you who have chosen to leave their prior family or household? If you believe children in your household meet these descriptions and have not been told your children will get free meals, please call or e-mail Pardeeville Schools, homeless liaison or migrant coordinator which is the Guidance Counselor at each school.
3. DO I NEED TO FILL OUT AN APPLICATION FOR EACH CHILD? No. *Use one Free and Reduced Price School Meals Application for all students in your household.* We cannot approve an application that is not complete, so be sure to fill out all required information. 4. SHOULD I FILL OUT AN APPLICATION IF I RECEIVED A LETTER THIS SCHOOL YEAR SAYING MY CHILDREN ARE ALREADY APPROVED FOR FREE OR REDUCED PRICE MEALS? Please read the letter you received carefully and follow the instructions. If your letter indicated you qualify for free meals, then no application is needed. If any children in your household were missing from your eligibility notification, contact the Lunch Program Monitor, either by email at andehe@pasdwi.org or phone 608-429-2153, ext. 210 immediately. If your household was notified it qualified for reduced price meals, we encourage you to complete an application to potentially qualify for free meals based on household size and income.

5. DO I NEED TO FILL OUT AN APPLICATION IF MY CHILD ATTENDS A COMMUNITY ELIGIBILITY PROVISION (CEP) SCHOOL? If your child attends a school that participates in CEP, receipt of free breakfast and lunch meals does not depend on returning this application. However, this information is necessary for other programs and may be used to determine if your household is eligible for additional benefits.
6. MY CHILD'S APPLICATION WAS APPROVED LAST YEAR. DO I NEED TO FILL OUT A NEW ONE? Yes. Your child's application is only good for that school year and for the first few days of this school year, through October 13, 2023, or when a new eligibility is determined. You must submit a new application unless the school told you that your child is eligible for the new school year. If you do not submit a new application that is approved by the school or you have not been notified that your child is eligible for free meals, your child will be charged the full price for meals.
7. I GET WIC. CAN MY CHILDREN GET FREE MEALS? Children in households participating in WIC may be eligible for free or reduced price meals, but it is based on income. Please submit an application.
8. MY CHILD(REN) QUALIFIES FOR BADGERCARE PLUS OR MEDICAID. CAN MY CHILD GET FREE MEALS? Children with BadgerCare Plus, Medicaid, or subsidized insurance may be eligible for free or reduced price meals, but it is based on household income and household size. Please submit an application to determine if your household qualifies.
9. WILL THE INFORMATION I GIVE BE CHECKED? Yes. We may also ask you to send written proof of the household income you report.
10. IF I DON'T QUALIFY NOW, MAY I APPLY LATER? Yes, you may apply at any time during the school year. For example, children with a parent or guardian who becomes unemployed or experience a financial hardship may become eligible for free and reduced price meals if the household income drops below the income limit.
11. WHAT IF I DISAGREE WITH THE SCHOOL'S DECISION ABOUT MY APPLICATION? You should talk to school officials. You also may ask for a hearing by calling or writing to: Pardeeville School District, Attn: Mr. LeMay, 120 Oak St., Pardeeville WI 53954.
12. MAY I APPLY IF SOMEONE IN MY HOUSEHOLD IS NOT A U.S. CITIZEN? Yes. You, your children, or other household members do not have to be U.S. citizens to apply for free or reduced price meals.
13. WHAT IF MY INCOME IS NOT ALWAYS THE SAME? List the amount that you normally receive. For example, if you normally make \$1000 each month, but you missed some work last month and only made \$900, put down that you made \$1000 per month. If you normally get overtime, include it, but do not include it if you only work overtime sometimes. If you have lost a job or had your hours or wages reduced, use your current income.
14. WHAT IF SOME HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS HAVE NO INCOME TO REPORT? Household members may not receive some types of income we ask you to report on the application, or may not receive income at all. Whenever this happens, please write a 0 in the field. However, if any income fields are left empty or blank, those will also be counted as zeroes. Please be careful when leaving income fields blank, as we will assume you meant to do so.
15. WE ARE IN THE MILITARY. DO WE REPORT OUR INCOME DIFFERENTLY? Your basic pay and cash bonuses must be reported as income. If you get any cash value allowances for off-base housing, food, or clothing, it must also be included as income. However, if your housing is part of the Military Housing Privatization Initiative, do not include your housing allowance as income. Do not include any combat pay resulting from deployment as income.
16. WHAT IF THERE IS NOT ENOUGH SPACE ON THE APPLICATION FOR MY FAMILY? List any additional household members on a separate piece of paper and attach it to your application.

ANNUAL NOTICES

ACADEMIC STANDARDS

The Pardeeville Area School District will be using the following academic standards for the 2023-2024 school year: Common Core standards for Mathematics and English Language Arts, including the Standards for Literacy for all Subjects. The Wisconsin Academic Standards will be used for Agriculture, Food and Natural Resources, Art and Design Education, Business and Information Technology, Early Learning Standards, Health Education, Health Science, Information and Technology Literacy, Marketing Management and Entrepreneurship, Music Education, Personal Finance Literacy, Physical Education, Reading, Science*, Social Studies, Technology and Engineering, and World Languages. *Science will be using Next Generation Science Standards. School counseling will be using Wisconsin Comprehensive School Counseling Model/ASCA.

STUDENT MEDICATION POLICY

All parents are asked to be aware of the district policy statement regarding the administering of medication to students during the school year. The policy provides for school personnel to administer medication only when certain procedures are followed. Parents of children who require medication to be administered during the school day or who may find that to be the case during the school year, should check with the appropriate principal's office to make sure that authorization is properly provided. A parental approval form must be completed and on file before medication (including aspirin) can be administered. Any questions regarding this policy should be referred directly to the appropriate building principal.

STUDENT RECORDS

The Pardeeville Area School District maintains student records for each student attending school in the District. These records include: (1) student progress records – courses taken, grades, immunization records, extracurricular activities and attendance; and, (2) student behavioral records – psychological tests, personality evaluations, records of conversations, written statements relating specifically to an individual student's behavior, tests relating specifically to achievement or measurement of ability, physical health records other than immunization records, law enforcement agency records obtained by the District and any other student records which are not progress records. State and federal laws require that the maintenance of student records assure confidentiality. The District has also adopted a student records policy and procedures. This notice is subject to state and federal laws and the District's policy and procedures.

Accordingly, the following shall apply in the District:

1. An adult student, or the parent(s) or guardian(s) of a minor student, has the right to inspect, review and obtain copies of the student's school records upon request in accordance with established District procedures. The District will respond to such requests without unnecessary delay. Copies of the District's student records procedures are available upon request at the School District Office, 120 Oak Street, Pardeeville, WI. Regular office hours are 7:30 a.m.-3:30 p.m.
2. An adult student, or the parent(s) or guardian of a minor student, has the right to request the amendment of the student's school records if he/she believes the records are inaccurate, misleading or otherwise in violation of the student's privacy rights. Complaints regarding the content of student records may be made in accordance with established District procedures. Copies of the District's procedures are available upon request as outlined above.
3. An adult student, or the parent(s) or guardian(s) of a minor student, has the right to consent to the disclosure of information contained in the student's school records, except to the extent that state and federal laws authorize disclosure without consent. One exception that permits disclosure without consent is disclosure to school officials determined to have legitimate educational or safety interests in the records. A "school official" is a person employed by the District who is required by the Department of Public Instruction to hold a license; a law enforcement officer(s) who is individually designated by the school board and assigned to the school district; a person employed by or working on behalf of the District as an administrator, supervisor, instructor or support staff member (including health or medical staff and policy-school liaison personnel); a person serving on the School Board; a person or company with whom the District has contracted to perform a specific task (such as an attorney, independent hearing officer, auditor, medical consultant or therapist); or a person serving on an official committee such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or assisting another school official in performing his/her tasks. A school official has a "legitimate educational interest"; if the official needs

to review a student record in order to fulfill his/her professional or District responsibility. The District also, upon request, forwards a student's records to another school without consent in accordance with state law for purposes related to the student's enrollment or transfer. District procedures outline the specific reasons for disclosure without consent and are available upon request as outlined above.

4. An adult student, or the parent(s) or guardian(s) of a minor student, has the right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education for alleged District noncompliance with federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) requirements. The name and address of the office that administers FERPA is: Family Policy Compliance Office, U.S. Department of Education, 400 Maryland Avenue, SW, Washington, DC 20202-5920.

Further, the School Board has designated the following student record information as directory data: student's name, address, telephone listing, date and place of birth, major field of study, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, weight and height of members of athletic teams, dates of attendance, photographs, degrees and awards received and name of school most recently previously attended by the student. This information may be disclosed to any person unless the adult student, or parent, legal guardian or guardian ad litem of a minor student informs the school that all or any part of the directory data may not be released without the prior consent of the adult student, parent, legal guardian or guardian ad litem. The District will not release directory data earlier than two weeks (14 days) after receipt of this notice or the opening of school.

SECONDARY SCHOOL STUDENTS

A secondary school student or the parent(s)/guardian(s) of the student may request that the student's name, school district assigned email address and telephone listing not be released to military recruiters or institutions of higher education without prior written parental consent. The District shall comply with such request.

Unless access to such information has been restricted by the secondary school student or the student's parent(s)/guardian(s) as outlined above, the District shall provide access to secondary school students' names, school district assigned email addresses and telephone listings, on request made by military recruiters or institutions of higher education. The District shall also provide military recruiters the same access to secondary school students as provided generally to post-secondary educational institutions or to prospective employers of those students.

PUBLIC NOTICE OF NON-DISCRIMINATION POLICY

The Pardeeville Area School District prohibits all forms of unlawful discrimination against students and other persons in all aspects of the District's programs and operations. Accordingly, consistent with section 118.13 of the state statutes, no person shall unlawfully be denied admission to any public school in this District, or be denied participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be discriminated against in any curricular, extracurricular, pupil service, recreational or other program or activity because of the person's sex, sexual orientation, race, color, national origin, ancestry, religion, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, or physical, mental, emotional or learning disability. The District likewise requires and enforces nondiscrimination in a manner consistent with the rights and obligations established under all applicable federal civil rights laws, including the current provisions of Titles IV and VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (race, color, religion, sex, or national origin), Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 (sex), Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act (disability), the Americans with Disabilities Act (including Title II of the ADA, which prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability in state and local government services), and the civil rights provisions associated with the District's participation in federal meal programs.

All District career and technical education opportunities are offered to students on a nondiscriminatory basis. Additional information regarding such program offerings and the applicable admission/participation criteria can be obtained on the District's website or by contacting any school's guidance office.

Children of homeless individuals and unaccompanied homeless youth (youth not in the physical custody of a parent or guardian) as identified under federal law shall have equal access to the same free, appropriate public education, including comparable services, as provided to other children and youth who reside in the District. Homeless children and youth shall not be required to attend a separate school or program for homeless children and shall not be stigmatized by school personnel.

The District shall provide legally-required accommodations and appropriate educational services or programs for students who have been identified as having a disability, regardless of the nature or severity of the disability. The District shall also provide for the reasonable accommodation of a student's sincerely held religious beliefs with regard to examinations and other academic requirements. Requests for religious accommodations shall be made in writing and approved by the building principal.

When acceptable to the complaining party, the District encourages informal resolution of discrimination complaints and related concerns. However, a formal complaint resolution procedure is available to address allegations of unlawful discrimination and/or any alleged violation of the

District's equal educational opportunities policies.

Discrimination-related complaints may be filed with the Compliance Officer. The Compliance Officer also serves as the District's Title IX Coordinator (sex discrimination and sexual harassment issues and complaints) and Section 504 and Americans with Disabilities Act Coordinator (disability rights and disability-based discrimination issues) for all student and all non-employment related matters.

By following all required procedures and timelines, complaints of unlawful student discrimination may also be filed externally with the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction, the Chicago office of the U.S. Department of Education's Office for Civil Rights, or, in appropriate circumstances, with any state or federal court or other agency of competent jurisdiction.

SPECIAL EDUCATION NOTICE

The local educational agency annually publicizes information about its special education procedures and services. The local educational agency's special education plan is published annually on the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction website. The local educational agency identifies, locates, and evaluates all children with disabilities, regardless of the severity of their disability, who are in need of special education and related services, including children attending private schools, children who are not yet three years of age, mobile children such as migrant and homeless, and children who are suspected of being a child with a disability.

The local educational agency locates, identifies, and evaluates all private school children with disabilities, including religious-school children who are residents of the local educational agency. The local educational agency consults with appropriate representatives of private school children with disabilities on how to locate, identify, and evaluate private school children with disabilities. The local educational agency ensures the confidentiality of data collected.

Anyone who has reasonable cause that a child might be a child with a disability can make a referral. Any parent, physician, nurse, teacher, psychologist, social worker or administrator of a social agency has legal duty to make a referral. Before making the referral, the person making the referral must inform the

child's parent of their intent to make a referral. If the local educational agency to which the referral is made is the local educational agency the child is attending under the Full-time Open Enrollment law, the local educational agency provides the name of the child and related information to the local educational agency of residence. Whenever the local educational agency receives a referral for a resident child attending school in another local educational agency under the Full-time Open Enrollment law, the local educational agency provides the name of the child and the related information to the local educational agency where the child attends school.

NOTICE TO STUDENTS AND PARENTS DIRECTORY INFORMATION

According to the Board of Education policy, the following items involving students are considered directory information and may be utilized by the school district in the newspaper, in activity and athletic programs, and other school communiqués: student's name; activity participation; height and weight in athletic activities; photographs, honors, degrees, and awards; name of school most recently attended; student's grade in school; parent or guardian's name. If any parent/guardian objects to or refuses to permit the District to designate the above listed information as directory information, they should advise the school district in writing via a letter addressed to the District Administrator's office within two weeks after publication of this notice. 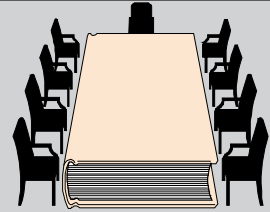
ANNUAL ASBESTOS NOTIFICATION

Motion to Approve Agenda
